PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

President Westrom welcomed everyone to the meeting and asked if there was anyone from the media in attendance and requested the discussion regarding borough business be kept to 3-5 minutes.

HEAR THE PUBLIC

Karen Ott, 1400 Merriman Road – read a letter dated 6/25/19 pertaining to the July 1, 2019 public forum (letter attached to the minutes). Karen also asked if there is enough parking at the fire station for anyone that has impairments.

COUNCIL – all stated yes that it is not marked handicapped, but you are able to park by the door.

Thank the road crew for coming around after the storm and fixing things so quick, unfortunately due to the last storm undone everything they did. We have a catch basin that needs a curb around it, so the water goes into it instead of running in my yard and on the side of it. It is literally a foot wide and a foot deep. If someone dodges a deer and the car goes over it can be serious to them and their car.

Steve White 475 Amsler Ridge Road. I would like to thank council members here that had the commonsense to try to vote no to having Amsler Ridge Road as the access road. It is ludicrous as I have stated many times, even Reed Powell here at the last meeting was shocked that would be a route. Obviously, he had the waste service for many years and that it was mind boggling that Amsler Ridge Road would be used for all this truck traffic. I looked at the permit a little further, bonding insurance I don't know if I am reading it correctly but it is kind of like a joke to me that there is only \$100,000 for the road for the access maintenance agreement for a bond I mean you can go ahead a monitor the road but what is \$100,000 going to do, especially with these rains. This is the same rider for all the permits so the other two sites as well, I don't know if that means \$100,000 for all roads used in the borough or what.

Mayor Borato – Addendums added maybe aren't with yours, I think they will be addressed later in the meeting.

Steve White – Certificate of liability insurance is like a contractor's insurance liability. Obviously, they are dealing with exposing gas radioactive waste, \$2 million dollars is kind of a joke.

Mayor Borato - There are additions to that.

<u>PARKS AND RECREATION</u> – Mr. Fetkovich – Borough had the first outdoor movie on Friday, June 21, 2019 Paddington2, had 65 people attending all went very well. I would like to thank the Parks and Recreation Committee for putting it together, especially Dave Hershberger and Frank Spinelli and their families that came over to help. I would also like to thank the Economy Borough Civic Club for helping. We also have two more movies scheduled this summer July 18th Sandlot and August 16th Home Alone. Everybody is welcome, everything is free. There are toys for the kids, popcorn, snow cones. It is a nice event. Park benches are nice, would like to see a pavilion be put up there next year. A lot of adults and elderly visit the park sitting in the hot sun and it would be nice to be able to go under cover. It would also be additional income for the Borough to rent out the pavilion. Would like to see a fitness trial put in the wooded area.

Mrs. Mutschler – Civic Club is going to buy 3 doggie bags and disposal. Two for this park and 1 for the other park. Sunset Hills does not seem like there is an issue at the park.

ORDINANCE - Mrs. Skonieczny – nothing to report

PUBLIC SAFETY- Mr. Bucuren nothing to report currently

<u>PROPERTY/BUILDING</u> – Mr. Morrone pricing on two doors.

<u>MAYOR'S REPORT</u> – Referred to an article in Borough News July 2019 issue under the Q&A section. Copy of the article is attached to the minutes.

<u>Solicitor - Mr.</u> Davenbrook filling in for Mr. Askar. Did speak to Joe about the Walmart assessment appeal no updates yet.

Borough Engineer – Prepared a letter to send out to the Cooney Hollow road property owners, will share with Mr. Askar for approval/recommendation. Hopefully the letter will go out this week.

Penn Energy access somewhat of an update from two weeks ago. First, with a revised report dated 6/19/19 the consultants for Penn Energy Stahl Schaeffer did provide a revised report that did address primarily the monitoring plan for the stability of Amsler Ridge Road. I forwarded that report to Joe Boward at Garvin, Boward, Beitko and by letter dated June 19th Mr. Boward did respond he had reviewed the revision to the Geotech plan and was satisfied with the amendments that were made. In terms of the Geotech part of it I think that is probably where we are at. I had some discussions with Penn Energy on some other issues and I did share it with Randy who forwarded it with Council on topics relative to the use of Amsler Ridge Road.

Casey, Penn Energy -As Mr. Shoup indicated various conversations we had at the meeting, listening to residents, other officials, there have been several concerns that have been raised and even in correspondence we addressed them. I thought it would be use for Borough Council purposes, and Penn Energy purposes to have special conditions as an addendum to the access maintenance agreement or the heavy hauling permit. This is in addition to the regular access agreement. It does require a road bond it is set by statute \$12,500/mile for a paved road. Access Maintenance Agreement requires us to hold the Borough harmless for its operations and the Borough additional insured. We carry liability insurance \$10 of millions of dollars. Regardless of the bond amount, Penn Energy is required to fix what it breaks. If the Borough would see the road is deteriorating and if Penn Energy refuses to fix it the Borough could shutdown the road and terminate the agreement. The Access Maintenance Agreement as it stands gives the Borough a wide birth to protect its citizens. With that said, this is a little different where we are proposing a proactive approach rather than run trucks and wait for things to break down and comeback to fix it. We are taking a proactive approach where we are stabilizing a slide area and bettering the road itself. Straightening, widening, doing the full depth reclamation, and putting pavement. These are special conditions.

Special Conditions to PennEnergy Resources Heavy Hauling Permit – Amsler Ridge attached to the minutes.

It seems like Penn Energy has addressed these concerns raised and we ask that Borough council give direction to the Borough Manager to grant the permit that has been requested.

Mrs. Skonieczny – I have a question, how do you plan on let's say you are not allowed to make a left hand turn coming from Sewickley Creek Road, lets say the truck is coming that way and can't make a left onto Amsler Ridge what provisions are there that the truck has to continue on and where is it going to turn around and come back?

Mr. Bowers – It will never go that way to begin with.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Are you saying there will never be a truck coming the wrong way.

Mr. Bowers – If they do, they are going to be cited.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Who is going to cite them?

Mr. Bowers - You have a police department.

Mrs. Skonieczny – So our police department is going to sit there and wait to see if trucks come?

Mr. Bowers – It would be against our direction and against weight limit on the bridge. That would not be a desirable for us what we do is have approved routes.

Mrs. Skonieczny - Based on your direction to have the Manager approve I still have some issues with the Geotech report. Although they said they don't find any geotechnical engineering reason not to recommend approval predicated on proper implentations in the June 19th revisions. Two other places I have questions, the next paragraph down states based solely on the documents to our Geotech engineer do not appear to be detrimentally affecting the health, safety, and condition of the public and/or public and private properties beyond the specific construction area or project owner's property(ies). So that tells me that this does affect the health, safety, and condition of the public properties in the construction area. As duly elected officials it is our job to make sure the health, safety of our residents is protected and by this statement it is clearly not. The last page it shows items not clearly shown on the plans/drawings and/or described in the submitted documents cannot be considered in our review. So, they didn't consider them if they were not clear. If such items become clear as the plans and investigatory programs evolve and are finalized, we may recommend that additional/supplemental geotechnical engineering investigation and/or analysis/evaluation be undertaken prior to the Borough granting approval. This is in the latest Geotech report. So based on that it is still premature and in addition the Penn Energy's response to question #3, I understand why they couldn't respond prior until they were pinned down to respond to it because it is all based on the monuments our Geotech engineer wants them to do is to put two more monuments lower on the wall. They cannot do that according to Penn Energy engineers until they get landowner approval. Same thing the monuments that have to be placed need landowner approval, I couldn't find widening of the road in the Geotech report where it was addressed so if they are widening the road and the landowner approval for monuments and right of ways have not been obtained yet then this plan is not finalized and it is incomplete and insufficient.

Mr. Bowers (Penn Energy) - Did you listen to the first special condition I proposed?

Mrs. Skonieczny – No condition, the condition is you get the approval and come to us with the plan. The finalized plan that is the condition. Your giving us conditions. Our condition to you, because of the health, safety to our residents our condition for you is to get these approvals, get these rights of ways then come back to us with a complete plan. Until then we have a duty to say NO because it is insufficient and incomplete, and you have no legal authority to present plans that you are widening the road and putting monuments on where you have no legal authority to do so. I don't understand that.

Mr. Bowers - Being that you are characterizing whatever is in this letter, I haven't seen yet.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Reference to what?

Mr. Bowers - I believe to the last letter from your Geotech consultant.

Mrs. Skonieczny – June 21, 2019

Mr. Bowers – Reviewing the letter

Mayor Borato - Let me ask a question, do, we know who owns the land?

RESIDENTS IN ATTENDANCE - Our land

Mayor Borato - So you have no problem with them putting the monuments there?

RESIDENTS IN ATTENDANCE - No

Solicitor (Mr. Davenbrook) – I had only $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours before the meeting to review this, but if I were to say when I received this letter, I would say the last two full paragraphs are boiler point language submitted with every single Geotech report they draft to alleviate liability of their own for what they don't know. I have read it, boiler plate language it is not anything specific in this geotechnical report.

Mr. Bowers – Everything that I can see from this letter is Garvin, Boward, Beitko was obtained by the Borough to address geotechnical issues and we addressed their concerns to their satisfaction.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Right, they can only address to your technical issues they cannot address legal issues. So, you're at an impasse here where your plan requires legal authority to do it.

Mayor Borato - They, the property owners just gave it.

Mrs. Skonieczny – They should be submitting the plans when finalized. They are not finalized; they are not the only owners.

Mayor Borato – Important to remember here, you council, manager, engineer are ultimately in control of the project so if something goes down and someone is calling us saying "hey these people are trespassing on my yard and I haven't gave them the right of way" manager, our engineer, can shut them down. It is up to them to have the legal right of way it is not up to us to have the legal right of way.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Your saying then this Council should approve plans that they can't legally do right now and we are not liable, then if we approve it and say go ahead if you get it you get it, if

you don't you don't, build the wall and if they can't get some of the right of ways they are going to come to us and say we spent hundred of thousands of dollars on this wall, you got to let us go.

Mrs. Mutschler – I don't think they are going to do that.

Mrs. Skonieczny – It's not what you think they will or won't do it is what is required.

President Westrom – The permit tells them they must build what we want. If they give us final drawings and we don't like them, we will tell them to build something different. The permit is only giving them the ability to start the process.

Mrs. Skonieczny – They can't start the project without right of ways. You are saying they can start the project without getting the landowners right of ways to get on their properties?

President Westrom – If they have the permit then they have the capability to get the right of way.

Mrs. Skonieczny – What did you say, if they have the permit what?

President Westrom - They would have the capability to get the right of way.

Mrs. Skonieczny - You need to have the right of way, legal authority to do it prior to.

Mayor Borato – You must be able to know you have the authority to build it before you spend money to get a right of way. Are you going to spend money to get a right of way because you want to build this new and glorious fence on your property and your going to ask your neighbors I want to buy this off of you because I want to do that and you go to the planning zone board and they tell you can't build that anymore?

Mrs. Skonieczny – First of all, these are savvy financers, you don't go into a right of way contract before it is all done. Can be a contingent on the permit being approved and the plans finalized and approved.

Mayor Borato – It still takes someone time and energy eventually they have a boiler plate. The bottom line is the people whose property they need are people who want the project.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Then it should be no problem to come back to us, so what is the problem then?

Mayor Borato – There is no problem once they get the permit they can go ahead and get the right of ways.

Mrs. Skonieczny – I disagree, once they get the right of ways then come finalize the plans both complete and enough then.

Mr. Fetkovich – Sound like the chicken and the egg.

Solicitor – Cart before the horse. I don't believe they are going to put themselves in a situation where they are not going to get these rights of ways, I don't know if we have a need for that.

Mrs. Skonieczny – You might not want to believe that, but I want to see that. With all do respect to you, I want to hear it from our solicitor. In fact, we did hear it from our solicitor in the last few meetings. I specifically asked him if they don't have the right of ways can they do the project, he said no.

Solicitor – I didn't see that earlier in the minutes.

President Westrom – If they don't get the right of ways, no project, this permit does not give them to do whatever they want.

Mrs. Skonieczny – So according to their plans they cannot do the project because of certain spots in the roadway that need to be widened.

President Westrom - If this permit gets approved, they cannot go and start this project tomorrow.

Mrs. Skonieczny – According to them I guess they could because it says on the juncture/Geotech report wherever I saw it, don't know where that is right now, it speaks about them being able to do things at certain junctures of the project. That tells me then they can start without having those certain right of ways in place.

Mr. Bowers – I'm here to tell you that we are not here to trespass on others property.

Mrs. Skonieczny – No doubt, I don't doubt that. What your going to say when you build the wall and say that we couldn't get the approvals this is as good as we can do it or when you build the roads because we couldn't get the landowners approval to widen it we are all ready here.

Mr. Bowers – That is why we proposed, and this is something that came down this is conditional placed above and beyond what any access maintenance agreement would carry with it. We heard your concerns last week and that is why we proposed the special conditions that we construct the wall and road betterment project as set forth in the drawings as a condition for us to use the road. We can't construct the wall and do the road betterment project as set forth in the drawings without getting the property owners approval to do so.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Exactly, until that is done then you come back. It wouldn't be fair to our residents, we have a July 1, 2019 meeting where everybody can voice their opinion. To ask us to vote on the permit tonight.

Mr. Bowers – We are not asking you to vote on it tonight. We are taking the position that this by Borough ordinance it does not require council to vote.

Mrs. Skonieczny – But whatever you requested, you still requested for us to direct the Borough Manager to approve it. I said it is unfair to our residents with is July 1st meeting coming up. We

gave you two weeks to come back with the Geotech report give the residents two weeks to have their meeting also.

Mrs. Mutschler – That July 1st meeting if you read how the ad was placed in the paper has nothing to do for the road it is for the well pad. No discussion about the road ordinance for the operations of the well pad

Mrs. Skonieczny – That's not true

Mrs. Mutschler – Yes, it is. Never going to sit here and agree on how you determine this permit should be issued. I basically said from day one in the history of the Borough we have never voted on an overweight vehicle permit. You're forcing us now that we came to vote for one now because you are saying these are different circumstances to me it is nuts. I read the permit whether it has a name on it, I read the same permit your forcing us, you want us to make a motion to authorize the permit for Amsler Ridge Road for Penn Energy. I would make that motion that we give directive to the Borough Manager to authorize the permit.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Let me clarify who you saying forcing, who is forcing?

Mrs. Mutschler – You as a Council a whole. They keep asking us to decide to vote on this permit for hauling on the road. We have never voted on this type of permit before.

Mrs. Skonieczny – We went through this a couple of meetings ago. Just because someone asked for a permit for a couple of days it is not the same under the municipal planning code, it is more than just a permit it is our responsibility.

 $Mrs.\ Mutschler-I\ read$ the law and read all the information. I have a motion on the floor to authorize the Borough Manager.

Mrs. Skonieczny – I was not finishing discussing, Penn Energy didn't you send a letter out to all the residents involved saying what the discussion was on July 1st and Amsler Ridge Road was a part of that?

Mr. Bowers – As far as what our letter is not sure of the advertisement states, but it was our understanding that this would all be discussed.

Mrs. Mutschler – Regardless if you sent the letter out, let's tell you we pay for the meeting. It is our meeting and how it was put in the paper to advertise.

Mr. Bowers – It's your meeting.

Mrs. Skonieczny - Residents have the right to speak.

Mrs. Mutschler – I didn't say they didn't have the right to speak.

Mrs. Skonieczny - You can't limit them and say they can't speak on Amsler Ridge Road.

Mrs. Mutschler – It is not here for discussion; it was how it was advertised.

Mrs. Skonieczny – I'm telling you Penn Energy is stating here, they will discuss the road.

Mrs. Mutschler – Who did you send the letter to, I didn't see it?

Mayor Borato - In a certain circumference.

Mrs. Mutschler – Would that have been the letter you would have to send based on our ordinance in a certain radius of people?

Mr. Bowers – This was a letter to our leasers in the area.

Mrs. Mutschler - In the requirement you had that you had to reach out in a certain radius?

Mr. Bowers – Our letter was to our leasers reached out to people who are within that radius, all are welcomed to participate. Our letter does not govern the subject on the meeting, it is a Borough meeting.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Did you not have in the letter they could discuss Amsler Ridge Road and even if you didn't whatever you said it is a part of the project.

Mayor Borato – Yes, to discuss it not to approve or disapprove. Informational session we want to hear concerns, what people are thinking because ultimately council, borough engineer, and our manager has the right to go and review that project on any given day and Mr. Shoup can come back to us and say something is hanky going on maybe we should have a cease and desist. Something simple.

President Westrom – Mr. Shoup didn't feel comfortable talking about all the conditions Penn Energy talked about. We invited Mr. Bowers (Penn Energy) to talk on these conditions at tonight's meeting.

Mrs. Mutschler – I have a motion on the floor Mr. Westrom seconded the motion to Grant the permit Amsler Ridge Randy to sign the permit.

Mrs. Skonieczny – I would like to say in the discussion part, no disrespect to you, I would like our solicitor to be here for this direction.

Solicitor – I can relay it to Mr. Askar. I have been involved. I have not had any discussions with Mr. Askar that leads me to believe that we are in a position that council should be denying this permit based on individual landowners' potential trespass. This permit is a hauling permit for overweight vehicles, it is not a permit to trespass on private landowners. I would advise Council that is not what your approving for Penn Energy to trespass without proper authority. Not for us to police it until someone comes to us saying they are trespassing on our property while widening the road they do not have the proper permission and we shut it down.

Mrs. Skonieczny – Their plan says they are going to widen the road until they have proper authority and do that, we cannot just say it is okay to start the project

Solicitor – This is not an approval to start a project to trespass on a person's property without proper approval. It is a permit.

Mrs. Skonieczny – It is a permit for a plan that shows to widen the road. There is nothing in the plan that shows they have the legal authority to do it. So, we are approving a plan where they have no legal authority but are showing us what they are going to do.

Old Business

Mrs. Mutschler – Feral Cat Ordinance – We talked about feral cat ordinance last meeting, I made a motion to approve it, I didn't get a second on it. I don't know if everyone got a chance to really read the ordinance and what it amounts to. I know there was a problem at the end where it said about if you don't abide there are penalties. You read it, it is based on the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedures. We didn't just pick it up anywhere to fine people, there were issues calls about cats, three feral cats who have 6 to 8 kittens. Randy did you receive a call.

Mr. Kunkle – He didn't call me today.

Mrs. Mutschler – We have nothing on our books to address these issues. We have people that are kindhearted to feed these cats. Well, an out of control cat can have babies three times a year so it gets out of hand if they find they are moving or gets too expensive to feed these cats this should not be on us. They also can be vicious.

Mayor Borato – I have two citizens in Sunset Hills that are having problems with them. One gentleman said he is going to leave out rat bait or antifreeze, oh good god how about if a kid see the blue antifreeze and thinks it is Kool-Aid or something, please don't do that, the other one says they are going to trap them, shoot them with their 22, I said you can't do that.

Mrs. Mutschler – You can't do that end up going to jail. It is doing more harm than good to feed those cats and running at large, they get diseases, it is not humane. Whether the police come,

and we tell them if you get these cats they must be on your property, can't be running at large. You neuter them, you take care of them, and now in charge of these cats.

Mayor Borato – Care, custody, and control of the cat.

Mrs. Mutschler – If not, we have Animal Control now, they have a way because we never had a problem, now they can address them. They can get them whether they re going to get them adopted but right now they are just running at large. It is more and more. Whether you move or not these cats stay around the vicinity of where they are at. We have worked on this several months, we had a consultant from Michael Baker, Jim Blumling, chairman, we worked several months to get something in place so we could take care of it.

Mr. Westrom – So this motion would be just to advertise it.

Mrs. Mutschler – Correct people can voice their opinions – goes to a magistrate going to get fined. An ordinance just to take care of the cats, jut like a dog. I would like to put it out there a motion just to advertise the ordinance for the nuisance. <u>Motion by Mrs. Mutschler, seconded by Mr. Morrone to advertise the ordinance cat nuisances</u>

Mrs. Skonieczny – Discussion I want to reiterate that I believe it is an unconstitutional ordinance. We can cage our residents now because we let our cats domesticated or undomesticated in our neighbor's yard. Problem of their wealth, problem via fines without due process. The other ordinances like I tried to explain to you imprison you to the failure to pay your fine. This just imprisons you for allowing your cat to go on a neighbor's property, and the way the ordinance reads is if you allow your cat domesticated or feral cat where you don't even have control of goes on a neighbors property can be fined and/or imprisoned. Not with the failure to pay the fine but fined or imprisonment for your cat going in the neighbor's yard. As I said in the email if you cat domesticated or feral cat goes into your neighbor's property then goes back to your property both property owners under that ordinance can be fined in imprisonment the way the ordinance reads. Then my question is if your going to imprison them which property owner you imprison the mother or father both property owners. It is ridiculous. It needs a lot of work on it and I don't think we should require our residents to put a leash on their domesticated cats.

Mrs. Mutschler – Why not

Mrs. Skonieczny – I'm sure if you took a survey of the residents who wants to put a leash on their domesticated cat it wouldn't be flavorful. $\mathcal{F}_{c,v}$

Mrs. Mutschler – If your neighbor doesn't mind your cat walking in his yard that is fine and dandy, but I don't want your domesticated cat walking in my yard. I have no recourse to come back and tell you I don't want your cat on my property. That is not fair. I do not agree with you, it is fine OR imprisonment, standard verbiage. I talked with the police chief, he agreed on it, have the consultant, we worked on it, so I agree.

Mrs. Skonieczny – For the record, I wish you guys would have worked months on the oil and gas ordinance instead of the feral cats. However, none the less, I think there are a lot of problems with this ordinance and I'm against it, council can do what they want – majority.

Motion by Mrs. Mutschler, seconded by Mr. Morrone, Motion to Advertise Ordinance Feral Cats – Nuisance.

President Westrom – Any other discussions? Mr. Kunkle roll call vote, yes to advertise.

Mr. Bucuren – Yes Mr. Fetkovich – Yes Mr. Morrone – Yes Mrs. Mutschler – Yes Mrs. Skonieczny – No Mr. Westrom – Yes

Mrs. Skonieczny – I would like my objection to put in the minutes.

President Westrom – Please put on the agenda next week Tax Collector

Solicitor – 30 days to appoint

Mrs. Mutschler – Randy did you go down and talk with Dorothy.

Mr. Kunkle – I stopped down there today, she wasn't feeling well. Talked with Nick in general terms how we can proceed once we get an interim appointed, how will we get the records from her. I did ask about the school district and he was not sure that their position was. I did speak last week to the business manager at the school who when finished talking told me he was going to get together with his solicitor, and I told him if his solicitor wants to talk with ours, I can help arrange that. The school district is concerned because their taxes are usually sent out by July 1st. It sounds to me it is going to be delayed until we get an interim collector appointed.

Mrs. Mutschler – I know he mentioned the school district get a post office box for taxes to go to.

Mr. Kunkle – He mentioned that to me as well, however there would not be a name attached to it, have an address. We need to decide quickly to do we want the person here, make space in another office.

Mayor Borato – Also have issues we need to talk about before elections. I reached out to a company Willscott on a 20×8 pricing attached to the minutes 24-month rental.
